

King Billy Cabernet Sauvignon 2018, Mount Barker 2018 was an exceptional vintage, and King Billy is a very limited production (125 dozen) for the best wine of the vintage. Deeply coloured and still youthful, this is indeed a great cabernet sauvignon. The one curiosity is the price, about half what I expected. It's all cedar and silk, blackcurrant fruit studded with ripe though discreet tannins., Screw cap, 14.5, **Rating** 98, Drink Span To, 2048

Styx Gully Chardonnay 2021, Mount Barker The fermentation and maturation in French oak has paid dividends; the varietal fruit is deep-seated and very complex, the mlf blocked, which will add years to the further complexity and freshness., Screw cap, 13, **Rating** 96, Drink Span To, 2034

Book Ends Cabernet Sauvignon 2019, Mount Barker West Cape Howe's 100ha Langton vineyard has some of the oldest cabernet plantings in Western Australia. 2019 was a difficult vintage, but the best blocks went to this wine, which has now developed lovely cedary characters, part fruit, part oak, and a long future ahead., Screw cap, 14.5, **Rating** 95, Drink Span To, 2038

Riesling 2023, Mount Barker The vineyard takes its name from the southernmost point of Western Australia, more specifically coming from the best blocks on the 45yo Langton vineyard. The perfumed, lime-infused bouquet is exceptional, the precisely calibrated palate continuing a beautifully sculpted wine. The price is ridiculously low., Screw cap, 12, **Rating** 95, Drink Span To, 2043
